## STEP 1 TEXT

Look at the **words and phrases** for any:

- · Repeated words or themes
- $\cdot$  Transition words (ie. but, therefore, for)
- $\cdot$  Images / metaphors
- $\cdot$  A truth, a command, a warning, a question
- Verbs—note past, present, and future.
  Who is doing this action?
- · Surprises !
- · Descriptions of God: the Father, Son, and Spirit
- · Big Bible Words
- $\cdot$  Theme words from the book

Looking at the **whole passage...** 

- $\cdot$  What kind of writing is this?
- · Who is writing to whom?
- $\cdot$  Are there any clues why the author is writing this letter?
- What tone or feeling is the author trying to communicate?
- Divide the passage into its natural sections, one for each major thought.
- $\cdot$  Create a heading or picture for each section and a one sentence summary in your own words.
- $\cdot$  Key verses
- $\cdot$  What does the structure reveal?
- $\cdot$  What is the authors flow of thought?
