## Q1: WHAT DOES IT SAY?

Look carefully at:

### The words and phrases

- · Repeated words or themes or contrasts
- · Transition words (ie. but, therefore, for, so that)
- · A truth, a command, a warning, a question
- · Verbs
- · Surprises
- · Descriptions of God: Father, Son, and Spirit
- · Big Bible words
- · Theme words from the book

## The whole passage

- · What kind of writing is this?
- · Who is writing to whom? Why?

### The **structure** of the passage:

- · Divide the passage into its natural sections
- · Create a heading for each section

## Q2: WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

#### Look at the context:

- $\cdot$  Read the passage immediately before and after.
- · Read supporting passages provided in the study, or your Bible's cross references.

So, what's the big idea of the passage?

# Q3: HOW DOES THIS PASSAGE REVEAL THE GOSPEL?

What do we learn about...

- · Who God is?
- · Who we are?
- · What God has done/is doing/will do?
- · How we are to make the gospel known?

# Q4: HOW DO I RESPOND TO WHAT GOD HAS REVEALED?

Sharing Jesus—What is one practical thing you have learned about how to pray for and reach out to those around you with the Gospel?

- · Are there any other ways God is calling you to respond?
- · What is one thing you are going to remember from this passage?
- · What is one thing you can ask for prayer for? This should be practical and personal.
