START WITH PRAYER



Q1: WHAT DOES IT SAY?

Look carefully at:

the words and phrases:

- · Repetitions, Contrasts, Surprises
- · Big Bible Words
- · Characters
- · If there is dialogue, who is talking to whom?
- · Setting (timeline and place). Does it change?
- · Mark any Old Testament quotes or allusions

the whole passage:

- · What kind of writing is this? (ie. narrative, poetry, parable, teaching)
- · How does the plot unfold? (Conflict? Climax? Resolution?)
- · Divide the passage into its natural sections
- · Create a heading for each section
- · Is there a major idea being communicated?

Q2: WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

Look at the context:

- · Read the passage immediately before and after, how does the context help us understand the meaning of the text?
- · Look up cross references. How do they help us better understand the passage?

What's the main idea of this passage?

Q3: WHAT DOES THIS PASSAGE REVEAL ABOUT THE GOSPEL?

What do we learn about...

- · How and why God saves us?
- · Jesus' role in God's salvation plan?
- · What it means to follow Jesus?

Q4: HOW DO I RESPOND TO WHAT GOD HAS REVEALED?

Identify one thing in particular that God has revealed to you in this passage. The questions below may be helpful:

SPECK

S—Is there a Sin to repent of and to avoid?

P—is there a Promise to believe and rejoice in?

E—is there an Example for me to follow?

C—is there a Command for me to obey?

K—is there Knowledge for me to freshly understand?

As you seek to follow Jesus in light of this truth, how can you pray, and ask for prayer?
